It is planned infrastructure that has been on the public record for the past 40 years. Significant expenditure has already been directed to this option, and significant State Government funding directed to this option also. Council documentation and modelling suggest that the ELP is fit for purpose when the EDE commences operation.

Question 1: what is your plan for a sustainable traffic solution for Queanbeyan?		The past Council developed the comprehensive Queanbeyan Road Network Strategy 2031. I understand that this Strategy is the result of substantial local and ACT traffic modelling, incorporates the EDE, ELP,

		Old Cooma Road Stage 1, Old Cooma Rd Stage 2, and Old Cooma Rd Stage 3 (yet to be commenced). It also addresses a number of intersection improvements. The result is to enable traffic from Googong, Tralee and Jerrabomberra to flow around Queanbeyan's CBD to the north east, or through to the Monaro Highway.

Question 3: If the EDE proceeds, what measures will you support to mitigate the impact on traffic through Jerrabomberra?		The Road Network Strategy 2031 identifies that the existing arterial roads through Jerrabomberra have been purpose build for the projected traffic, with the EDE providing a complementary alternative traffic route.

Issue 4: <i>The JRA supports the development of a major district sporting centre and community facility. Question 1: How would you help achieve this?		Council planning and development documentation shows the Poplar Regional Sports Centre and the Regional Aquatic Centre as proposed for development. Moving from developmental phase to planning and Commencement phase will require a needs based assessment. One way to establish this is to forge relationships between local, greater Queanbeyan, and ACT based sporting entities, schools, State Government Sports and Recreation Departments, Health Authorities and Council. The establishment of an advisory role in Sport and Recreation for a Councillor would be one way to drive this.

Question 1: How do you intend to engage and be inclusive of all QPRC residents and in particular of Jerrabomberra residents?		I have no political alliances. Group B policy is unbiased and inclusive representation. Central to our platform is that no one should feel overlooked or overburdened, and no one should feel left behind as a result of this merger. We're all in this together now and my style of governance will be about unity and inclusion. That Council table must be about working for the good of the entire regional, city about urban community as a whole. I will not be working for one "patch" over another. Many communities in the newly merged Council, especially those in the far east and far south are also concerned about under representation. Many communities are fearful. I feel that. My commitment to fairness will address that.

		How to engage? Presence is a big part of successful engagement. Ensuring I attend important community events, seeking opportunities for informal contact with groups such as mothers groups, sporting teams, and the school P&F for example. You can learn a lot about a community over a cup of coffee.
